"Good Kids" Still Need a Savior

S imon came to my class at the Calvary Bible Institute as a homeschooled young man who had never been in trouble with the law. Even so, this *good kid* still needed a Savior. Meet Simon in his own words:

I was born in the tiny town of Walnut, Illinois into a family of seven children. Since we didn't live close to any sizeable town, we children had few friends outside the family. We were home schooled which made a little difference in our isolation from others.

Because of the home-school setting, my parents came over as more disciplinarian than you would think of most parents. They didn't seem approachable to me, and none of us felt very close to them. We relied on each other for friendship and moral support which created a bond of closeness between us that we still have.

Even though my father had severe anger issues at times, I have no doubt that he was and is a Christian. The only problem was that he seemed to be constantly "discipling" us children about something. I guess I viewed his discipleship program as overdone. Putting all that aside, he was an active Christian who was highly involved in a ministry called the Gideons, and often took some of us to the Gideon functions.

I figured that since I went to church every Sunday, prayed, read the Bible every morning, and my mom and dad were Christians, that I was a Christion too. I now see that I had a head knowledge of the Bible, and knew all the stories. But I had never been convicted of the gravity of the sins in my life.

God's Word had not meant much to me, even though I had read the Bible through several times. It didn't mean much because I had not received revelation of the God of the Bible. That is how it was—until one night.

I was about to do my mandatory Bible reading, and God brought to light a completely unscheduled verse outside my regular Bible reading calendar. I opened my Bible and read Luke 6:46, "And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?"

This verse pierced my soul.

I had not thought my sins were all that bad, but God in that moment showed me all of my sins were bad, and He convicted me of all of them. That was the moment I truly and totally gave my life to Jesus, confessed all my sins, and took Him as my Savior and Lord. All the Bible knowledge that I had gained finally went from my head to my heart, and now I could get what life was all about.

Since Jesus has come into my life, He has changed both my way of life and my way of seeing life. Before, I was an angry, unforgiving, sour person who just hid it well. Since he came into my life He has given me forgiveness and love, especially for my father, where there was none before. The love He put in my heart not only changed the way I see people, it changed the way I treat them too.

It has now been five years since I have been saved, and I have been at Calvary Commission since September 2016. Even though I've been here such a short time, I have learned more about God and His Word than I probably could have ever learned in many years just having my daily devotions. I came to Calvary because I realized how busy my life was getting—almost too busy for God, and I knew that wasn't good.

Although Calvary is not a bed of roses, I am getting exactly what I came for, and that is to spend time with God and getting to know Him and His ways. Even though I still struggle with the sins of life that are common to man, my goal is God, and with His help I will prevail. A verse that means so much to me now is Philippians 3:14, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.
