Christmas at the Base

Christmas season at Calvary Commission in Lindale, Texas is a little like at your house except there are ministry opportunities mixed in with activities for the students. The lights are up around the doors leading to the Chapel. In a corner of the chapel, chairs have been removed and a large Christmas tree has been put in place. That area has couches, arm chairs, and a coffee table like a large living room. It's where students and staff can catch a moment between classes or their job assignments and sit and visit, making it a home away from home.

It varies from year to year, but on the average about three-fourths of our students have been to prison. The other fourth come for the Bible School and mission training. We are a discipleship training, but at the same time a great effort is made to have a "home atmosphere" for the students as much as possible.

At the back of the Chapel auditorium is the cafeteria. As a part of the Christmas season, a special meal was prepared for the students. Eight-foot tables were placed end to end and covered with red tablecloths, with colorful center pieces. It looked festive.

About November 27 the students had a choice to go to Santa Land or to stay on campus and watch the movie *It's a Wonderful Life*. This time of year, anyone driving on I-20 can see the reflection of lights coming from the 24 acres of lights of Santa Land. As you enter the park, you are surrounded by more than two

million lights everywhere you drive. As a drive-thru Christmas light display, it's the first of its kind. There is a 250-foot tunnel of 25,000 flashing and dancing lights and at the exit, 12-foot toy soldiers. Various Christmas music is coordinated with the light displays to give a super holiday experience. (If interested, Google "Santa Land Tyler.")

Several activities are planned throughout December. From the 10-12th a group of the students will help construct a building for a local Tyler ministry. The 13-17th is an outreach to Reynosa, Mexico to the orphanage, the church and street ministry. About 20 students will go on this trip. On the 18th another family night is planned with a special meal and activities.

"Hope at Christmas" is on the 19th. The students prepare a special night for the children who have a parent in the local Smith Country Jail. The night is planned to bring cheer and Christmas gifts

to the children. There will also be a meal for them at the Church of Living Hope in Tyler.

In fact, throughout the year, each Wednesday night the students at Calvary Commission use about four vans and pick up underprivileged children, bring them to Church of the Living Hope, provide a meal, and offer classes for each age group.

The two or three days around Christmas day, most of the students will go to be with their families. There are usually 10 or 12 former inmates who are restricted to the base because of parole requirements. There is always something special planned for them at Christmas.

To us at Calvary Commission the slogan "Jesus is the reason for the season" has maybe a deeper meaning than for some. Jesus was born, died, arose, and lives that He may transform lives. After their transformation, it is not uncommon for students to say, "That man or that woman doesn't live anymore."

It makes little difference to us Christians whether or not December 25th is the correct birth date; the fact is Jesus was born and is busy transferring many sons and daughters from the kingdom of darkness into the Kingdom of God. Christmas is a perfect time to celebrate our living Jesus in us.
